

What is a vision statement?

The vision statement should be a clear and inspiring description of what the subject aims to achieve in the future. It's like a guiding star—defining aspirations and setting a long-term direction. Think of it as answering the question: "Where do we want to go?" It's meant to be ambitious, motivating, and forward-thinking.

Guiding criteria:

- Makes clear what is unique to the subject
- Reflects the key drivers in the context of that subject
- Is focussed on the essence of the subject
- Future focussed

Vision statement

Through learning another language, students develop a range of capabilities to make, share and mediate meaning across languages and cultures. Students will explore the dynamic relationships between language, culture, and identity, cultivating empathy, open-mindedness, and respect for diversity.
