The vision statement should be a clear and inspiring description of what the subject aims to achieve in the future. It's like a guiding star—defining aspirations and setting a long-term direction. Think of it as answering the question: "Where do we want to go?" It's meant to be ambitious, motivating, and forward-thinking.

Guiding criteria:

What is a vision statement?

- Makes clear what is unique to the subject
- Reflects the key drivers in the context of that subject
- Is focussed on the essence of the subject
- Future focussed

Vision statement

Politics, Power and People enables learners to critically engage with key political concepts, diverse political perspectives, challenge misinformation and advocate for equity and justice in local and global contexts. Through inquiry-based, interconnected learning, reflection and the development of multiliteracies, students become adaptive, ethically grounded, civic-minded, and politically aware global citizens.

Students examine how individuals, institutions, and corporations shape political agendas, public opinion, and democratic processes. Meaningful engagement in real-world democratic and community initiatives, fosters empathy, ethical understanding, intercultural awareness, and respect for differing viewpoints – contributing to inclusive, sustainable, and informed societies.
