SACE Art Show 2023 award winners celebrated

Kadina Memorial School student Lily-Anne Marks brought the Fleurieu Peninsula to life with her semi-abstract artwork *Victor Harbour*, winning the public vote for the SACE Art Show Community Award first prize.

The award will be presented at the closing ceremony held at Light Square Gallery this evening. A range of awards are presented, thanks to the generosity of sponsors including The Honourable Nat Cook Minister for Human Services, the Australian Education Union, Eckersley's Art and Craft, Flinders University, the Independent Education Union SA, and the Adelaide Central School of Art.

Each year one student's work is selected for the following year's Art Show poster. The winner of the 2023 Poster Award is Brooke Woodbridge from Thomas More College.

Her artwork, *Critically Endangered*, is a multi-layered piece exploring profound challenges our communities are facing. "This artwork was about the realisation of how ironic it was for me to see elephants as a symbol of safety and protection, when they are a critically endangered species.

"It was also a commentary on COVID-19 and the wastage of medical masks and how this impacts animals and the environment. I created a gallery version as well as a street art version, which was temporarily a wall mural at my school."

Over the last month, 141 art and design works were selected for display in the exhibition at Light Square Gallery. All works remain available to view in the online gallery for the rest of the year.

SACE Board Chief Executive Michaela Bensley applauded the diversity and creativity on display:

"The works in this year's exhibition don't just showcase the amazing talent of our young artists and designers, they are visual representations of the passion and problem solving, dedication and diligence across the thriving class of 2022. Each student has brought to life their distinctive way of expressing themselves. I love being surprised by the unpredictability of each year's exhibition.

"Whether or not these students continue a career path with art and design, I'm confident they have nurtured their passions and developed a profound appreciation for the role that creativity and expression plays in all areas of the community."

The Minister for Education, Training and Skills Blair Boyer is looking forward to celebrating with the students: "I am thrilled our SACE students are given an opportunity to showcase their work in this way. I commend their creativity and unique artistic perspective."
